Franklin, founded in 1796 by General William C. Schenck and named for Benjamin Franklin, is in the northwest corner of Warren County. Franklin hugs the Great Miami River, which contributed to its history as a paper manufacturing center. Today, the City's commercial and industrial base is becoming increasingly diversified, thanks to its strategic position along Interstate 75 in the vigorously growing Cincinnati-Dayton corridor. It's historic town center, lining the east bank of the river, though, remains a real treat.
